



Overview of Practice Activities

The following is a complete list of the practice activities that students may encounter in *Wordly Wise i3000™*. These activities help students begin to embed vocabulary words in their long-term memory. In Level 2, there are three practice activities per lesson (Scenes 3–5), while there are four in Levels 3–12 (Scenes 3–6). The activities vary by lesson and by level.

- **Words and Their Meanings**

Students either select the word that matches a given definition or the definition that matches a given word. They begin to embed words and meanings in memory.

- **Completing Sentences**

Students must choose the phrase that correctly completes each sentence, using context clues to determine whether a word is used correctly. They deepen their word knowledge through exposure of the correct use of a word in different contextual sentences and gain exposure to multiple word meanings.

- **Seeing Connections**

Students read four words and identify the word that is not related to the others. They must carefully consider meaning as they categorize and classify words based on similarities and differences.

- **Making Connections / Understanding Word Relationships**

Students are required to relate new words with words they already know. They consider word relationships by linking new words with familiar words, helping students own and retain the new words better.

- **Applying Meanings**

Students answer questions that use vocabulary words in a specific context. To select the correct answer, students will use their full knowledge of each word's meaning built in previous activities.

- **Using Context Clues**

Students read a sentence that is missing a word, and then select the correct word from four choices to complete the sentence. They use context clues to determine which of the four words fits best into the sentence.

- **Using Words in Context**

Students read whole sentences that place vocabulary words in context. They use context clues to determine whether these words are being used correctly in each sentence.

- **Just the Right Word**

Students read fill-in-the-blank sentences, using context clues to type a vocabulary word (or form of the word) into the space provided to correctly complete the sentences. Phrases that define the words are provided as hints to give students practice relating words to their meanings.

- **Word Study**

Through a variety of Word Study activities, students will deepen and extend word knowledge by identifying synonyms and antonyms, exploring prefixes and suffixes, solving analogies, learning Latin and Greek word roots, or distinguishing between homophones.

- **Determining Meanings**

Students complete sentences with a given word (or form of the word) from the word list. Based on knowledge of roots, suffixes, and prefixes, students determine if words correctly or incorrectly complete the sentences.

- **Finding Meanings**

Students read four phrases, using contextual and syntactical information to match two of the phrases into a correct and complete sentence.

- **Understanding Meanings**

Students read sentences that provide definitional information and are asked to identify correct and incorrect definitions. Then they rewrite the incorrect sentences to express the words' correct meanings.

- **Determining Precise Meaning**

Students read a given sentence in which a vocabulary word is used correctly, providing them with specific context to determine word meaning. Then they read two paraphrases of the sentence and select the one that accurately conveys the same contextual meaning as the given sentence.

- **Using Words**

Students decide whether a given vocabulary word (or a form of the word) correctly completes each of three fill-in-the-blank sentences. Students use their knowledge of the word's meaning to assess whether it should be placed into a sentence.

- **Images of Words**

Students practice applying word meanings in a more sophisticated way. Students read a given word (or form of the word) from the word list and then select sentences that correctly illustrate the meaning of the word.

- **Understanding Contextual Meanings**

Students identify correct and incorrect uses of vocabulary words in sentences. Then they apply word knowledge by writing their own original sentences that use the words correctly.
