PROGRESS MONITORING SKILL CHECKS

Each Skill Check includes a list of ten words that contain the skill focus of the lesson. Provide five words or ten words for each Skill Check, depending on the time you have available. Have students record their responses on a sheet of paper.

Read the word, the sentence containing the word, and then the word again, as indicated in the script. Repeat the script several times to ensure that all students hear the word and understand the sentence.

Allow time for students to write the word. Do not continue with the next word until all students are ready.

Collect student work and circle any words that are spelled incorrectly.

- If you used five words for your skill check, a passing score is four correctly spelled words (80%).
- If you used ten words for your skill check, a passing score is eight words (80%).
- Scores of less than 80% may indicate that a student needs additional practice or reteaching.

Use the Student Sheet to keep track of each student's Skill Check scores.
